A4 size Posters are not acceptable. A5 Landscape is the maximum size used, but smaller adverts. are very welcome. I can use A5 portrait forms by turning them 90 Deg. A5 size is the same size as used in the Review.

Advice of closing date for contributions will go out about middle of the month before publication. E.g. Mid February for a March Bugle to be circulated about the end of February/beginning of March.

Photos of small groups seem to reproduce fairly well in B&W, but photos of large groups end up a shambles. Nevertheless you may submit photos but if they do not come up reasonably clear their inclusion is doubtful.

It is not easy to come up with an article very week but a number of Clubs do help in this way.

## POSITION INFORMATION

As mentioned on Page 5 below are the abbreviated descriptions position as printed in the Constitution, Bylaws or contributions from present holders of these positions.

### PRESIDENT

The President presides at all General Meetings, Executive Committee Meetings and Management Committee Meetings of the Society. The President shall be an ex-officio member of any Society sub-committee.

The unwritten part of this job description is the accepted situation where the President is the public face of the Society and is the person responsible for order and the operation of the Executive and Management committee.

### 17. TREASURER

The Treasurer is responsible for all monies received on behalf of the Society.

The Treasurer makes payments from the funds of the Society with the authority of either a GM or the Management Committee and in doing so, ensure that all negotiable instruments issued by the Association are signed by two of the three authorised Committee Members these being the President, Secretary or Treasurer.

The Treasurer submits an up-to-date Financial Statement to each MCM and they have custody of all securities, books, documents and records of a financial nature.

### PROMOTIONS AND PUBLICITY COORDINATOR: -

The Promotions and Publicity coordinator shall act as a sub Committee is to promote Square Dancing and to seek out ideas to assist clubs in the recruitment of new dancers.
