Good News for 2012.

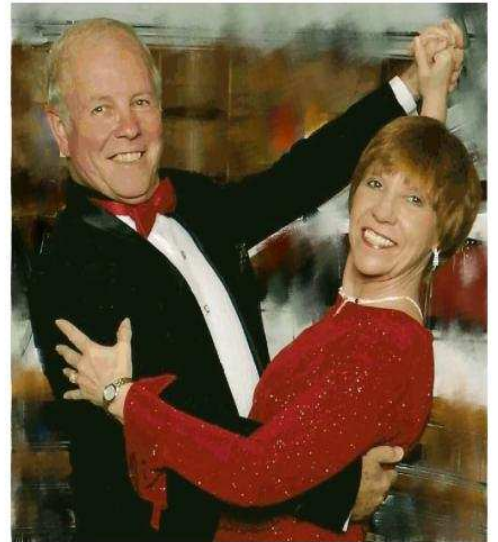
George and Pam Hurd will be returning to Australia again in 2012.

Last month , we looked at the first of the two trial additions to the Rumba's and Cha's on the Square Dance rounds list , the **Alemana**. This month is the second of the movements **The Aida**. Here is the walk-thru .

From butterfly position, think ; through, side and behind to finish back to back.

Timing - QQS;

Man foot work - FWD TRN, SD TRN, BK, -;

Lady foot work - (FWD TRN, SD TRN, BK, -;)

MAN: Forward right tuming right face, side left continuing right face turn, back right, -;

WOMAN: Forward left tuming left face, side right continuing left face tum, back left, -;

NOTE: May be done from Semi-Closed, Butterfly, Open or Open Facing Positions. If done from Butterfly or Open Facing Positions the first step would be thru between partners for both man and woman. Ends in a "V" Back-to-Back Position. May be done in opposite direction.

Both of these movements are easy to achieve, but if you still need help please feel free to contact one of your local Cuers or the ARDA Education Officer, Paula Armstrong.

We are approaching Armistice Day, Poppy Day or Remembrance Day (all the same day) the opportunity arises to share with readers a very simple, meaningful poem and a little of the its history. This is probably the most remembered poem to come out of WW1

On May 2, 1915, John McCrae's close friend and former student Alexis Helmer was killed by a German shell. That evening, in the absence of a Chaplain, John McCrae recited from memory a few passages from the Church of England's "Order of the Burial of the Dead". For security reasons Helmer's burial in Essex Farm Cemetery was performed in complete darkness.

The next day, May 3, 1915, Sergeant-Major Cyril Allinson was delivering mail. McCrae was sitting at the back of an ambulance parked near the dressing station beside the *Yser Canal*, just a few hundred yards north of Ypres, Belgium. As John McCrae was writing his *In Flanders Fields* poem, Allinson silently watched and later recalled, "His face was very tired but calm as he wrote. He looked around from time to time, his eyes straying to Helmer's grave. Within moments, John McCrae had completed the "In Flanders Fields" poem and when he was done, without a word, McCrae took his mail and handed the poem to Allinson.

And so on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month it is fitting to remember all our soldiers, sailors and air force personal who have served our country in war, peace and peace keeping exercises.

In Flanders Fields

In Flanders Fields the poppies blow
Between the crosses row on row,
That mark our place; and in the sky
The larks, still bravely singing, fly
Scarce heard amid the guns below.
We are the Dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,
Loved and were loved, and now we lie
In Flanders fields.
Take up our quarrel with the foe:
To you from failing hands we throw
The torch; be yours to hold it high.
If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders fields.

COL McCrae was wounded in May 1918 and was taken to one of the big hospitals on the coast of France. On the third evening he was wheeled to the balcony of his room to look over the sea towards the cliffs of Dover. The verses were obviously in his mind, for he said to the doctor ""ell them, if ye break faith with us who die we shall not sleep." That same night COL McCrae died.
