The Queensland Square Dancing Society Inc.

Some may think I am early when I write about the Society's AGM, but here is insufficient time available in the New Year.

Please understand that the Society is a necessary body in this activity and new blood is desperately needed. Having one job in such a body is not an arduous burden and the enthusiasm new members bring to such a body is priceless. Read the comments and job descriptions below and please give consideration to being a nominee for one of the positions mentioned. Nomination forms will be available in the November & January BUGLES.

The positions due for consideration at the next AGM are Vice President, Secretary, Registrar, Country Regions' Coordinator, Executive Assistant, Promotions and Publicity Officer and sufficient dancers to balance any discussion at Management and General Meetings.

It may confuse some when we see positions filled at the previous AGM being put up for ballot again when elected members are elected for a two year term. Last year some of these positions were vacant and thus it was correct to fill these positions as soon as possible, but to keep things in their correct rotation some of these positions need to be considered again this year. Failing any disruption to the rotational system the successful nominees will hold their positions for two years.

Some of us are wearing multiple 'hats' so that all positions are filled but this is not a good idea. Individually, no position on the Management Committee is a big job but collectively multiple jobs are relatively big.

In my own case I am trying to do three jobs and I feel I am not doing too well at times in any of the three situations.

The President's position requires a fair bit of keeping a lookout for potential problems, giving consideration to future happenings and keeping an eye on how the administration is operating etc.

The Promotional situation could be as big as the occupant considers it necessary to be. We have applied for a promotional grant and that is about the extent of my activity in this area. I was aiming at having a push for members in the New Year but that is very dependent on a successful outcome from the Grants Commission.

Being the Editor of the BUGLE is an ongoing job, which by itself is a great situation. Ask someone for an article, get an idea, research it and write about it, hear a good yarn and type it up for future use, assemble incoming articles, have them checked, assemble them in BUGLE format and out the BUGLE goes.

Secretary can be a bit time consuming around meeting times but we have increased the use of email and this has eliminated a large percentage of postal mail. The Incorporation Act defines the job.

Looking at other positions such as Registrar is a different kettle of fish altogether. The work here is fairly concentrated about midyear when the renewal of memberships is in progress and the remainder of the year is just accepting new members' applications. The requirements of the position are outlined in the Incorporation Act and are thus straight forward. All that is needed is a Computer online and an aptitude for this type of work.

Vice-President has no defined job other than fill in for the President when requested to and chair meetings in the absence of the President.

The Executive Assistant is available to assist or replace the Secretary or the Treasurer or Registrar if that person is absent or requires assistance from time to time; keep the Queensland Square Dancing website up to date; act as the Society Librarian and maintain the procedural manual of the Society. Country Regions' Coordinator is a position which will be examined again in the not too distant future. It is difficult to define this job when we have Clubs spread over several thousand kilometres. Irrespective of the difficulty, we need to give country Clubs a means of being involved in Square Dancing activities.

If you have an interest in any of the above jobs, and I hope you do, and wish to know more, please contact this scribe and I will do my best to answer any questions. Successful nominees will be members of the Society's Management Committee, the body which administers the activity in Queensland.

Making Brochures:

The aim is to get the attention of your client.
AND

Give them a strong reason to be involved NOW.

How;

The front cover or the opening part of the page has one primary purpose and that is to catch the client's eye and make them want to read further AND to do that there has to be a specific benefit for them.

It is no good talking about how clever you are, the world is too busy to be motivated by that or the name of your organisation or some clever graphics.

Your brochure needs to tell them what benefits are involved for them. **GET THEIR ATTENTION.**

Identify with your prospects. Early in the open paragraph clearly emphasis (for example) 'how you needed more social life' and what you did to achieve this.

Next, talk about the other benefits available through the use of this product.

Write about the desired outcome from the readers point of view.

Lastly, write about how easy it is to become involved. The instructions need to be precise and clear. You would like to try some social dancing. Ring xxxx and they will make arrangements for someone to pick you up and bring you along.

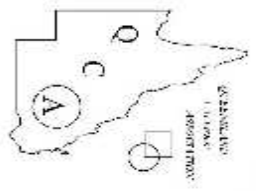
