A large number (400 +) have taken out membership and we thank them for their support.

At first individual insurance was emphasized as the 'big' benefit of individual membership in the Society. Individual insurance was always meant to be a bonus of membership. Another hoped for benefit of Society Membership was a discount for members at Society functions. E.g. Roundups and Christmas Parties etc. When enrolment reaches a significant point we may be able to offer these and other benefits to members of the Society.

The important component of individual membership is your opinion, moral support, some attendance at meetings if possible or just an interest in the future of square dancing in Queensland. If you are not a member please give membership some consideration. For the price of two and a half cups of coffee or a couple of beers per year you can be a member of the Society. A glaring mistake in the present Constitution was only allowing for one general meeting a year. This is in the process of being corrected. Mind you it would be a very silly committee that went against the obvious feelings of a meeting.

If you attend a meeting you won't be lumbered with a job. Everything is voluntary. A polite "No thank you" is a good enough reason to not accept a nomination for a position or a particular task.

Some will say membership is 'not my problem'. Well, you are entitled to your opinion, but it would be beneficial to square dancing if you gave your support to those dancers who willingly do make the effort to help the activity. Round Dance Corner

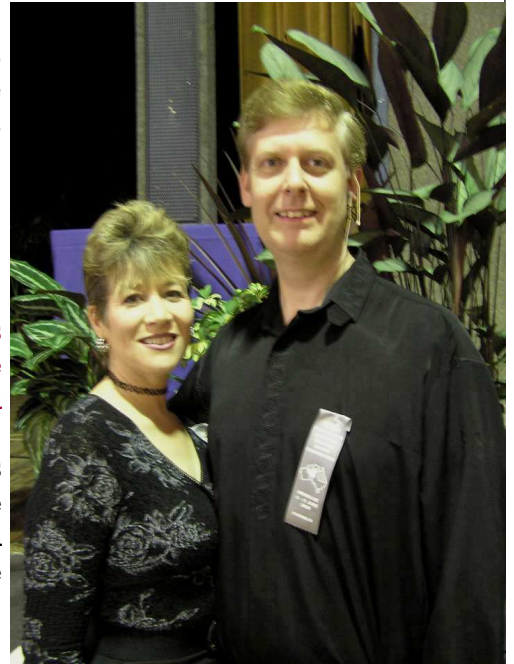
