This article is about billeting. Thanks Lyn for telling of the methods used successfully in your area. NM.

"We (Suncoasters) just had a very successful weekend with Jerry Jestin. Part of the dancers who enjoyed this event were billeted. The arrangements for this type of accommodation went well, and appeared to have been appreciated. There were a few hiccups in the early stages as we set the system in place, but finally it all went well, and we think that the following system is workable. We had one contact person (call them X for the moment) for billeting – they take details of people offering billets, whether they have single/doubles available, and dogs, cats, etc. which may be problems for dancers with allergies.

When a dancer rings to ask for a billet, X provides the caller with the contact details of a person who has offered something, and it is then up to that dancer to contact the person and make arrangements.

An old guy (not in the best of shape) was working out in the gym when he spotted a sweet young thing... He asked the trainer that was near by "What machine in here should I use to impress that sweet thing over there?"

The trainer looked him up and down and said "I would try the ATM in the lobby"......

This allows people to sort out their own arrangements and takes the burden of last minute changes and so on off the shoulders of X. (Important!!) Although we were inviting strangers into our homes, one of the important aspects is that the people involved (dancers) are generally a pretty homogenous and well-known type of person.

My thought is that if we could get this billeting going, it would enable more visitors to attend other Clubs' functions, lifting attendances which in itself seems to lift enjoyment. In order to get it going, we would ideally contact each other Club and ask them if they were interested, and if so, to nominate a billeting person (X2) for their Club. I thought that the best way to do this would be to publicise it in the Bugle, so that Clubs could decide for themselves whether they would like to be involved without any pressure by personal calls. I'd be happy to answer queries or provide information.


